PATCH	Patch Name	AG Name	How the Patch is earned
	Teambuilding	Circles	Child helps parent plan and host their Circle Meeting. There will be a creative invite turned in for the meeting.
	Sportsmanship	Sportsmanship	Child acting with exemplary sportsmanship on more than one occasion. This can be at a Y event or at any other Sports activities the child is involved in.
	Adventure Guide Spirit	Adventure Guide Spirit	Child recites from memory the following three from the Adventure Guide program: 1) Program Aims, 2) Program Motto, and 3) Program Pledge. This would be done to the circle Navigator or a Federation Officer.
	Faith	Faith	1) Child attends the Chapel service at one of the campouts and also does 1 out of the 3 listed below. 2) Child actively helps his/her circle lead a chapel ceremony at a campout. OR 3) Child says Bible Verses to Officer. OR 3) Child gives (can be read) opening prayer at circle meeting.
	Caring	Caring	Child actively participates in an event or activity helping someone who is in need. (i.e. going to a nursing home to visit a shut in, visit someone at the hospital to cheer them up or deliver a meal to someone in need, etc.) This could be a circle event.
	American Flag	Patriotism	Child answers 5 questions about America or recites the Pledge of Allegiance to officer or circle navigator.
	Positive Attitude	Cheerfulness	Child shows a good attitude towards others in circle activities and on campouts on a consistent basis, when cheerfulness might not normally be expected.
	Leadership	Leadership	Child learns about one major leader of their choosing, and then answers 5 questions about that leader. Child also explains what it means to be a leader.
	Service	Service	Child, with parent's supervision, spends 2 hours engaged in charitable work in their community. This could be done at the YMCA, School, or Church. The activity cannot directly be related to AG, (i.e. setting up derby races would not count but hauling debris from the creek would) This could be a circle activity, but the child needs to be present the whole time.
	Science	Science	Child collects and correctly identifies (common and scientific names) one of the three A) 6 different types of insects and/or spiders. Or B) 6 different types of trees from the leaves. Or C) 6 different types of rocks.
	Responsibility for our World	Responsibility for our World	Child participates in PEAK (Promoting Environmental Awareness in Kids) the REI program with their circle. This is part of the Leave No Trace Center for Outdoor Ethics.
	Outdoor Living Skills	Orienteering	Child works with parent (and possibly up to one other child and their parent) to map 6 major landmarks behind the YMCA, each no less than 50 ft apart. Or Child completes Orienteering course on campout along with drawn map.
	Honesty	Honesty	Child is "caught" being honest in circumstances in which honesty might not be expected of a child.
	Hiking	Hiking	Child goes on hiking trail with dad and or circle on two campouts and completes the full trail. Done at Camp Classen in Oklahoma and Johnson's Peak at Camp Grady Spruce. One of the hikes could be done on a family outing
	Observatory	Astronomy	Child draws a map of the night sky showing 5 constellations, and then correctly points out those 5 to an AG officer or circle navigator.

	Archery	Archery	Child hits the target any where in the ring while on an Adventure Guide campout.
	Induction Ceremony	Opening Ceremony	Child participates (attends) the Opening/Induction Ceremony one time during the 4 year program that the child is in Adventure Guides.
	Horseback Riding	Horseback Riding	Child goes horseback riding at two different campouts.
	Canoeing	Canoeing	Child goes canoeing with dad or another adult on campout. The child will demonstrate how to use a canoe, water safety knowledge, and understanding.
	Family Involvement		Child actively participates around the house in household duties. That is helping to set the table for meals, clean their place after a meal, pick up their dirty clothes, kept their room straight and bed made, helping in the yard or taking out the trash. Saying the prayer at family meal time. These would be part of a normal routine not done just once. To take part in a family night shared activity once a week. To spend quality time with your family.
